YORK REVOLUTION (41-31, 1-1) at Bridgeport Bluefish (37-35, 1-1)

Game #73 - Saturday, July 10, 2010, 6:05 p.m.

The Ballpark at Harbor Yard - Bridgeport, CT

RHP Corey Thurman (6-4, 4.36) vs. RHP Denny Stark (4-1, 4.33)

REWIND! The First Half champion York Revolution play game 3 of the Second Half's opening 4-game series (1-1) in Bridgeport tonight. It's also G3 of a 7-game, 8-day road trip which will also take the club to Long Island. The Revs and Bluefish split four games in York last weekend to close the First Half. York's win in the opener clinched the First Half title for the Revs.

First Half Champs: The Revs finished the First Half with a record of 40-30, just one win shy of matching their best half ever. It was by far their best First Half ever; in fact, it was their first winning record in a first half (had finished 11, 10, and 18 games under .500 the first three years). The Revs finished with a 4.0-game lead over Somerset, and spent 39 games in First Place, including each of the final 21. Since May 22 (13-15), the Revs finished 27-15, winning 9 of their final 13 series (9 of 11 at one point).

Schedules Flip: The Second Half schedule is an exact mirror of the First Half schedule, with home and road matchups flipped. After concluding the First Half with a 7-game homestand against the Ducks and Bluefish, the Revs now open the Second Half with a 7-game trip to Bridgeport and Long Island.

The Opener: Thursday marked the 3rd time that the Revs have opened a half in Bridgeport. Twice, they've opened seasons at Harbor Yard. The Revs played their first game in franchise history at Bridgeport on May 4, 2007, losing 15-8, but won their 2009 season opener in Bridgeport 8-4. The loss Thursday was the Revs' first in a second half opener (3-1). They beat the Bluefish at home to open the second half last season. The Revs are also now 5-3 all-time in opening games of any half (2-3 road, 1-2 in Bridgeport).

Different Look: The Revs made a series of roster moves during the All-Star Break. They released LHP Justin Hampson (4.96 ERA in 11G), and deactivated Enohel Polanco, who is now strictly a member of the coaching staff. York also signed RHP Celson Polanco (no relation to Enohel) and INF Victor Rodriguez, a career .348 hitter in the Atlantic League, and former league batting champ. Rodriguez suited up with Bridgeport and Newark earlier this season.

Worst to First! The Revs are just the 3rd team in league history to go from dead last overall, to first half champs the following year (Nashua 1999-2000, Newark 2006-07). Both of those clubs won the league championship; the Bears' 2007 team was led by current Revs Herrera, Castro, and Pachot. Prior to the Revolution, York's last pro baseball team, the 1969 York Pirates, won the Eastern League pennant with an 89-50 record (.640) after going 58-82 the year before (.414, 5th place, 26.5 GB).

History Lesson: The Revs have sewn up their second playoff berth in club history, and the 13th playoff berth for any pro team from York. This September, they'll try to become the 5th team in York pro baseball history to go all the way to a league title, and first since the York Pirates were declared 1969 Eastern League co-champions with Pittsfield in their final year, despite trailing the series 1-0 before several rain postponements. York teams also won championships in 1904, 1906, and 1925.

What a First Half Title Could Mean: The last 6 Atlantic League Champions have all won first half titles, and all 4 ALCS participants the last two years have won the first half. All-time, 10 of the 12 league championships, including 10 of the last 11, have been won by first-half winners, and 16 of the 20 ALCS participants since the advent of divisional play in 2000 have won the first half.

Calling the Plummer: Jarod Plummer (2-0) was brilliant last night (6.1 IP, 5H, 1R, 1BB, 5K), earning the victory in a 2-1 win. It was especially impressive, given that in the previous two games (last Sunday, and Thursday's opener), two Revs All-Star starting pitchers had been hit up for their roughest outings of the season by Bridgeport. Derell McCall gave up 8R on 7H and 3HR in 4.1 IP last Sunday, as his ERA climbed from 2.56 to 3.46. Freedom Division All-Star starter Jesus Sanchez was touched for 7R on 8H and 2HR in 2.1 IP Thursday night, as his ERA rose from 2.37 to 3.34. The Bluefish hit 6HR vs. York in those 2G, beating York 10-7 and 10-5 (5 of those 6 HR came vs. McCall and Sanchez). All 6 of those HR have come with men on base. The Revs had hit 5HR in those 2G and 7HR in the previous 4G, but all had been solo shots. Neither team went yard in last night's pitchers' duel.

Road Warriors: The Revs lead the league with a 21-13 record on the road, and have won 7 of 9 series on the road (3 straight, 6 of last 7). York has won 10 of their last 14 road games overall (had lost back-to-back on road for just 5th time all year until last night).

Suring it Up: The Revs have committed just 36 errors in the last 58 games, after committing 22 errors in their first 14 games. The Revs had a club record 8-game errorless streak, June 9-16 (went a record 76 consecutive innings without a miscue).

Slamming the Door: Over the last 37G (since May 30), the 'pen has tossed a 3.63 ERA (139.0 IP, 104 H, 56 ER). The pitching staff has finished leads after at least the 6th in 29 of their last 31 tries (25-in-a-row to begin that streak). The 'pen has recorded SVs in 16 of the last 24 wins (Muller-7, Stidfole-4, Rodriguez-4, Hampson-1).

Revs vs. Fish: The Revs are 7-5 vs. BRG this season (3-2 road). York is 38-32 all-time vs. BRG, their best mark vs. any opponent. They've gone 27-10 at home vs. BRG, but just 11-22 at Harbor Yard. They've won 16 of the last 21 meetings at home, dating back to 2008. The clubs are playing 8 consecutive games against each other (3-3 through the first six). The Revs and Bluefish split a four-gamer in York last weekend; it was the first ever series between the two clubs held at Sovereign Bank Stadium that York did not win. The Revs had won each of the previous 10 home series.

This Date in York Baseball History: July 10, 2006 - Name York's Team contest results are unveiled, with Revolution (25.9%) narrowly edging White Roses (24.1%); Choppers, Dukes of York, and Steel Horses also received votes... July 10, 2009 - Tim Harikkala ties a club record with his fifth straight win, as the Revs open the second half with a 2-1 victory over the Bluefish... July 10, 1979 - Former White Roses outfielder Del Unser (1966-67) sets a major league record by hitting his third consecutive pinch-hit homerun for the Phillies, against the Padres.

Today's Starter: RHP Corey Thurman

Last Start: Suffered loss the night after the Revs clinched the First Half title, losing 6-4 vs. Bridgeport... line = 7.0 IP, 7H, 6R, 4ER, 2BB, 8K... struck out the side in the 1st... allowed just three hits (two infield knocks and a bloop) through first five shutout innings... allowed 3R (1ER) in 6th after nearly being out of the inning on a couple of close pitches (Andy Etchebarren was ejected in the following half inning for arguing the strike zone with home plate umpire Jason Kline)... Wily Mo Pena broke up shutout with two-run double to right, and a third run scored on an error... was an out away from allowing just 3R through 7.0 IP, but allowed three-run HR to Danny Putnam... 7.0 IP was a season-high, and the first time he had gone 7.0 since July 3, 2009 in Lancaster, nearly a year before to the day... 8K was his most since 8/18/08, also in 7.0 IP, and also in a loss (at SMD)... 8K is most by a Revs pitcher this season... HR to Putnam was his first allowed in 4GS (since June 11)... picked off former Toronto teammate Josh Phelps at first base to end the 4th, his first pickoff of the year, and club record 8th in a York uniform.

All-Time Leader: Thurman is the Revs' all-time wins leader, a distinction that he notched on June 22 vs. Somerset, moving past Wayne Franklin with a win over Somerset. He is 21-16 for his Revs career; Franklin was 20-8.

Streaks: Thurman began the season 4-0 for the first time in his pro career, and became the first pitcher in Revs history to open a season 4-0 over a single stint (Wayne Franklin did it over two stints with the club in 2007, and Bob Zimmermann later joined Thurman at 4-0 this season)... at that point had matched his longest career winning streak by winning 6-in-a-row dating back to last season (longest career streak with York)... 4 straight wins matched his longest single-season winning streak with York for the third time (twice in 2008)... then went on a 3-game losing streak, his longest skid since beginning the 2008 season 0-5... the Revs had lost 4 of his previous 5GS, after winning each of his first 5... went on to win next two starts, but Revs have lost his last two (ND, L).

That Close: Thurman has come within a whisker of masterpieces in his last two starts. On June 27 in Newark, he was one out away from allowing just 1R through 7.0 IP, but allowed a bases-clearing triple to Kennard Jones after hitting the #9 batter with an 0-2 pitch... he ended up with a ND, charged with 4R in 6.2 IP, after retiring 11 of previous 12 hitters entering the 7th. In his last start, he allowed just 3H (two infield hits and a bloop) through 5.0 scoreless, and was one out away from allowing just 1ER through 7.0 IP, but gave up a three-run HR to Danny Putnam (finished 7.0 IP, 6R, 4ER).

2010: Was the Revs' Opening Night starter, marking the second straight year that he started the Home Opener... came within one out of a win, allowing just two runs in 4.2 IP vs. Camden on April 27... allowed just two hits in 5.0 innings, earning his first win, May 2 at Lancaster... struck out Scott Spiezio looking for his 200th strikeout with the Revs, May 14 vs. Newark, coming in his record 50th start with the Revs... allowed 4SB in one inning (3 by Lydon, including double steal of home), Memorial Day at SOM... established a Revs record for wins in May with 4... allowed exactly 2R in 6 consecutive starts, April 27-May 24... did not allow more than 2R in any start until his 8th start (May 31 at SOM, 4R)... allowed back-to-back-to-back HR leading off the 6th on just 4 pitches, 6/5 at SMD; occurred after giving up just 1R in first 5.0 IP... earned record-tying 20th win in Revolution uniform on June 16 in Camden (6.0 IP, 3H, 1R, 1BB, 7K)... earned his record 21st win in a York uniform, beating Somerset to begin the crucial head-to-head series, June 22 in York... was one out away from allowing just 1R through 7.0 IP, but allowed a bases-loaded triple to Kennard Jones, June 27 at NWK; Revs eventually squandered five-run lead and lost.

2009: Became the first pitcher in Revs history to start in the Atlantic League All-Star Game; fired two scoreless innings for the Freedom Division... his 3.28 ERA would have finished T-2nd in the league given enough innings to qualify and would have set a Revs record for a single season, but was forced to miss nearly two months with small blood clots in his pitching hand... was scratched from his first scheduled start of the second half on July 13 with numbness in his hand (Revs were in midst of 4-0 start); was scheduled to face SMD, but Revs went on to lose 5 straight from that point, falling out of contention for the remainder of the year... placed on DL on July 18... returned to the mound on September 12 at home against Lancaster, and made two starts in September, allowing just 1ER in 9.0 IP... won 4 of his final 5 decisions... went 2-3 with a 5.14 ERA at home (opp .319), but was 2-0 with a 0.75 ERA on the road (opp .183)... allowed only 4HR all year (went 8 starts without allowing one at one point), after serving up 29HR in 2008... struck out the first four he faced to begin the season, and allowed just one bloop hit in 5.0 near-perfect innings in his first start, April 26, 2009 at BRG.

2008: Went 11-9 with a 5.39 ERA for the Revs, making a team-record and career-high 29 starts (tied for league lead)... became Revs' first 10-game winner when he defeated Long Island on September 4, 2008... his 165.1 IP ranked #4 in AL, came within two outs of matching his career-high, and is a Revs' single-season record... T-4th in league with 129K... Revs won 16 of his final 22 starts (11-3, 4.05) after losing his first six (0-5, 9.49); twice won 4 straight (won 8 of 9, 11 of 13 after opening season with career-worst 5-game losing streak)... combined on 4 of team's 8 shutouts, including in back-to-back starts, June 6-12, 2008, part of team-record 24-inning scoreless streak... named Atlantic League's Pitcher of the Month in June (4-0, 1.64) winning the Revs' first-ever monthly award.

In the Revs' record book: All-time franchise leader in career wins (21), starts (59), strikeouts (243), innings (324.2), quality starts (17), pickoffs (8)... entering his 3rd season with York, joining only Jason Aspito, Keoni DeRenne, Luis Taveras, Wayne Franklin, and Jason Olson as the 6 players / 3 pitchers to have suited up with the Revs for parts of 3 seasons.

Previous Career:

- 13th pro season... Spent all of 2002 and part of 2003 in the majors with Toronto (3-4, 4.75, 49G, 4GS)... debuted at age 23... fired 1.2 scoreless innings in his major league debut, April 5 vs. Minnesota; struck out Doug Mientkiewicz, the first batter he faced... fired 6.0 scoreless innings in his first major league start, August 2, 2003 at Anaheim
- Came up with the Royals organization after being drafted in the fourth round of the 1996 draft... led the Carolina League with a 2.26 ERA in 2000... was a Texas League All-Star with Wichita in 2001
- Underwent rotator cuff surgery in 2004, performed by Dr. James Andrews in Birmingham... Returned to affiliated ball with the Brewers' Double-A affiliate in Huntsville in 2006 and was among league leaders with a 2.96 ERA... was one of the Southern League's best relievers with Huntsville in 2007.

Personal:

- Graduate of Texas High School in Texarkana, TX where he was a teammate of major league outfielder Craig Monroe... Lives in York year-round, giving private lessons at Sovereign Bank Stadium during the off-season... is the son of a retired Army captain, and was born at Fort Gordon (GA); moved to Germany and Korea with the family, and eventually back to the U.S. at Fort Belvoir (VA) by age three... was recruited out of high school to play college football.

#31 Ryan Basner - RHP Went 1.0 IP or less in each of first 18G... had 1.65 ERA through first 18G... Worked 4 straight perfect innings, June 4-11... retired 28 of 33 BF over 10G, June 4-24 (allowed 1R on 2H over 9.2 IP)... Signed May 18... did not allow a run or walk in first 5.0 IP... went 3-2 with 6SV and 2.88 ERA for SOM last season... former 7th round pick of ATL; spent entire previous career with ATL, including parts of 4 seasons at AAA.

#23 Jim Heuser - LHP Had solid 6G stretch, June 18-27: 3.2 IP, 1H, 0R, 1BB, 5K... pitched in 6 of 7 days, June 23-29... struck out two LHH on 6 pitches, June 24 vs. SOM... Acquired from LAN in trade for Adam Witter, June 11... went 1-0 with a 3.71 ERA in 21G with Lancaster.

#31 John Muller - RHP Acquired from LAN with Adam Witter in trade for Salomon Manriquez on May 26... First 5G with York: 4SV, 6.0 IP, 2H, 0R, lowered ERA to 1.09... went 1-1 with a 1.45 ERA in 15G/1GS for LAN; held opponents to .164 average... earned SV in Revs' 200th win in his first appearance, May 28 vs. his former team... pitched in both games of June 20 DH in Lancaster, and earned SV in opener, striking out both he faced... ERA was at 1.76 through June 20... walked only 3 in first 12.0 IP with York... 5SV in June set a club record for that month... converted each of first 7 SV opportunities; 7SV is a Revs' First Half record (previous: Nick McCurdy-6 in 2008).

#28 Celson Polanco - RHP Signed/activated July 8... owns career 3.57 ERA... spent last two seasons in Blue Jays organization, reaching Double-A last year... posted 2.17 ERA for Dunedin in 2008... originally signed with Astros in 2002... has made 37 career starts (last was in 2007).

#34 Jason Richardson - RHP Allowed no runs in 8.0 IP spanning 6G, May 29-June 11... allowed 1H in 8.2 IP spanning 7G, May 29-June 15... walked none and struck out 10 over the course of 7G (7.1 IP), May 21-June 6... Began season on 8.2-inning scoreless streak; first 6 outings were scoreless... Made three appearances with York during the season's final week last year... spent previous two years in SOM bullpen (2007-08); went 9-2 with a 3.69 ERA for Patriots' championship team in 2008... reached AAA with BOS in 2006, and also has time in MIN/ATL systems.

#17 Matt Riley - LHP In relief: 27.1 IP, 9ER, 20H, 15BB, 35K (27G) = 2.96 ERA (just 1ER in first 13.1 IP)... ERA out of the 'pen was at 2.25 through first 23G... Walked only 3 while striking out 17 in his first 13G in relief... Entered in a bases-loaded, no-out jam and allowed no runs, May 18 vs. LI.

#20 R.J. Rodriguez - RHP Retired 19-in-a-row, June 16-24... 17 of 20 outings have been scoreless... Has allowed just 1R on 2H in 12.0 IP last 11G (3BB, 17K); allowed no runs and no hits in first 8.0 IP on that stretch... Did not allow run in 8.1 IP over 7G, May 29-June 10 (beginning with second appearance)... Signed May 24... led Carolina League with 27 SV last year for Lynchburg... in 4 pro seasons, is 17-11 with a 3.78 ERA and 72SV... spent first 3 years in SD system, before pitching in PIT system last season.

#16 Sean Stidfole - RHP Team record 18.1-inning scoreless streak, May 19-June 22; also went team-record 17-straight appearances without allowing a run... Last 25G: 25.2 IP, 19H, 2R, 5BB, 15K... Last 27G: 5BB, 19K... earned the SV in 3 straight appearances, May 30-June 18, and has tied his career-high of 4SV (2008 with New Hampshire)... Struck out side for first SV, completing sweep May 30 vs. LAN... Joined team in spring training after being released late by Toronto, despite going 3-1 with a 3.70 ERA at AAA Las Vegas last year, and posting a 3.27 ERA at AAA Syracuse the year before... is 18-13 for his career with a 3.68 ERA in five pro seasons, all in Toronto's farm system.

#10 Eroid Andrus - OF *Yesterday:* 1-5 *Trip:* 2-9 *Series vs. BRG:* 8-25, HR, 2B, 2RBI, 3R *Streak:* 12 (17-48, .354)

- Started at all 3 OF positions in his first 4 games... Signed June 11... hit .368 over 8-game hitting streak, beginning with second game played... HR in back-to-back games, June 18-19 at LAN... 19-game errorless streak, June 13-July 1.
- Is the older brother of Texas Rangers SS Elvis Andrus... has played in the NYY, MIN, and TB organizations, reaching Double-A Montgomery with the Rays in 2007 and 2008... is a career .270 hitter in 9 pro seasons... hit .302 with 9HR, 48RBI, and 15SB in 90G with Florence in the Frontier League last season, his first foray into independent baseball... was one of the top hitters in the Venezuelan Winter League this year.

#9 Ian Bladergroen - 1B *Yesterday:* 0-4 *Trip:* 1-8, 2B, 2RBI *Series vs. BRG:* 5-23, 2 2B, 3RBI, 2R *Streak:* 0 (0-4)

- Went 0-for-2 in 2nd career All-Star Game Tuesday night (also an All-Star in 2004)... 12HR (#2 in league) was Revs' most ever in the First Half... 44 RBI was two shy of club's first half record (Tom Collaro-2009)... became second player in Revs history to take part in HR Derby, clubbing 1HR to reach semifinals on Tuesday night; Nate Espy also took part in 2007 HR Derby.
- Hit .565 with 4 HR and 11 RBI on 5-game streak, June 24-28 (9 RBI in final 3G of that stretch)...
