YORK REVOLUTION (43-36, 3-6) vs. Newark Bears (25-54, 4-5)

Game #80 - Sunday, July 18, 2010, 5:00 p.m.

Sovereign Bank Stadium - York, PA

RHP Derell McCall (6-2, 4.00) vs. RHP Ryan Glynn (1-0, 0.00)

RevITUP! The First Half champion Revs wrap up their first home series of the Second Half, with the rubber game against the Bears. The Revs played the first 7 games of the Second Half on the road spanning an 8-day trip (2-5), their longest of the season. The Revs are returning home for the first time since July 4; they went 3-4 on their last homestand.

Football Scores: The Revs have scored 10+ runs in 3 of the last 5 games. They scored 10 on Tuesday, 14 on Thursday, and 16 last night. They've won two of those three games, but have given up 9 or more in all three. They won the highest scoring game in club history on Thursday night 14-13 at Long Island, coming back from down 7 to notch their largest comeback ever. They allowed a season-high in runs that night despite winning. Last night's 18 hits marked the second time they've had 18 hits in a game against the Bears this season; the Revs are hitting .325 against Newark pitching.

Fifth Avenue: The Revs set club record for runs (12), hits (10), and PA (16) in an inning last night, with a 12-run 5th. It surpassed previous records of 9 runs (2x), 8 hits (several times), and 15 plate appearances in one inning. Victor Rodriguez and Jose Herrera each hit grand slams in the inning.

Grandiose: The Revs now have 3 grand slams in the last 3 nights, after hitting just 1 previously all season. It's only the second time in club history that the Revs have hit two grand slams in less than 7 days (July of last season). Herrera has become the 3rd player in Revs history to hit two grand slams in one season (Aspito-2008, Padgett-2009). Reliever Paul Fagan gave up both slams, and has now allowed 5HR vs. the Revs in 8.0 IP this season. The Revs have hit 16HR in only 12G vs. Newark.

Coming Around? The Revs have won two of their last three, but are still just 2-5 in their last 7 games, 3-7 in their last 10, and 5-10 in their last 15, their roughest stretch of the year. The Revs tonight are attempting to snap a streak of 4 straight series that they've failed to win (0-3-1) after winning 9 of their previous 11 series. They're seeking a series win for the first time since June 25-27 at Newark.

For Starters: Revs starters have struggled of late. Over the last 6G: 1-3, 11.08 ERA (26.0 IP, 46H, 35R, 32ER, 14BB, 18K, 8HR)... over the last 10G: 2-6, 10.00 ERA (45.0 IP, 72H, 53R, 50ER, 22BB, 30K, 13HR). Bob Zimmermann (6.2 IP, 5R, 4ER) earned the first win by a starter in 7 games last night (since Jarod Plummer won July 9 at BRG).

First Half Champs: The Revs finished the First Half with a record of 40-30, just one win shy of matching their best half ever. It was by far their best First Half ever; in fact, it was their first winning record in a first half (had finished 11, 10, and 18 games under .500 the first three years). The Revs finished with a 4.0-game lead over Somerset, and spent 39 games in First Place, including each of the final 21. Since May 22 (13-15), the Revs finished 27-15, winning 9 of their final 13 series (9 of 11 at one point).

Worst to First! The Revs are just the 3rd team in league history to go from dead last overall, to first half champs the following year (Nashua 1999-2000, Newark 2006-07). Both of those clubs won the league championship; the Bears' 2007 team was led by current Revs Herrera, Castro, and Pachot. Prior to the Revolution, York's last pro baseball team, the 1969 York Pirates, won the Eastern League pennant with an 89-50 record (.640) after going 58-82 the year before (.414, 5th place, 26.5 GB).

History Lesson: The Revs have sewn up their second playoff berth in club history, and the 13th playoff berth for any pro team from York. This September, they'll try to become the 5th team in York pro baseball history to go all the way to a league title, and first since the York Pirates were declared 1969 Eastern League co-champions with Pittsfield in their final year, despite trailing the series 1-0 before several rain postponements. York teams also won championships in 1904, 1906, and 1925.

What a First Half Title Could Mean: The last 6 Atlantic League Champions have all won first half titles, and all 4 ALCS participants the last two years have won the first half. All-time, 10 of the 12 league championships, including 10 of the last 11, have been won by first-half winners, and 16 of the 20 ALCS participants since the advent of divisional play in 2000 have won the first half.

Road Warriors: The Revs have the league's best road winning percentage (.564, 22-17). They are coming off what was by far their roughest road trip of the season, going 2-5 and losing both series. They had won 7 of their previous 9 series on the road, and were 20-11 on the road at their high point. The Revs have lost 6 of their last 8 on the road overall. They have had worse trips however; six times in club history, the Revs have returned home from a minimum 6-game trip with only one win. Their worst was an 0-6 jaunt to BRG/SOM last season.

Suring it Up: The Revs have committed just 41 errors in the last 65 games, after committing 22 errors in their first 14 games. The Revs had a club record 8-game errorless streak, June 9-16 (went a record 76 consecutive innings without a miscue).

Slamming the Door: The Revs' pitching staff has finished leads after at least the 6th in 31 of their last 34 tries (25-in-a-row to begin that streak). The 'pen has recorded SVs in 17 of the last 25 wins (Muller-7, Stidfole-5, Rodriguez-4, Hampson-1).

Revs vs. Bears: The Revs are 8-4 against Newark this season (3-2 home). Their first three losses all occurred by giving up leads in the Bears' last at-bat, missing a chance at sweeps each time. All-time, the Revs are 25-45 against the Bears (12-22 home, 13-23 road). The Revs have won 14 of the last 20 meetings overall dating to last season (had been 11-39 vs. the Bears at their low-water mark). Sandy DeLeon, John Pachot, Ramon Castro, Enohel Polanco, Liu Rodriguez, Jose Herrera, and Victor Rodriguez are all former Bears. Pachot, Castro, Herrera, and Victor all won a championship with Newark in 2007.

This Date in York Baseball History: July 18, 2008 - The Revs storm out of the All-Star break with a 9-6 win at LI behind a 20-hit attack... July 18, 2009 - The Revs and Barnstormers play the second Route 30 DH. York lost 7-5 at home in the early game, before clubbing 3HR to win the nightcap 6-2 in Lancaster. Josh Johnson's three-run HR was the big blow.

Tonight's Starter: RHP Derell McCall

- **Deserving Honor:** McCall was named to the Freedom Division's All-Star team, one of a club-record 7 Revs to represent the team at Long Island on Tuesday night. It was the first All-Star appearance of his professional career.
- **That's a Record!:** The Revs are on pace to set several club records this season, including wins. Three members of the pitching staff, including McCall, set a new club record for wins in a First Half with 6 (also Zimmermann, Thurman). The previous record was 5 (Wayne Franklin and Aaron Myette, 2008).
- **Last Start:** Took a no-decision in the Revs' 11-10 loss at Long Island on Tuesday... line = 4.1 IP, 8H, 6R, 6ER, 3BB, 5K, 2HR... Revs came back from down 6-2 to take a brief lead, and from down 10-8 to tie it in the 8th before eventually losing on a walk-off single.
- **Looking to Get Back on Track:** McCall's ERA has climbed from 2.56 (#3) to 4.00 (#10) over his last 2GS (0-1, 14.54 ERA, 8.2 IP, 15H, 14R, 14ER, 6BB, 7K, 5HR). His ERA ranking was as high as #2 in the league (2.47) entering his start on June 29. The Revs have lost each of his last 3GS, after winning 7 of his first 8GS (7-in-a-row) and each of his previous 8 appearances (11 of previous 12 appearances overall). He has gone just 4.1 IP in each of his last 2GS after going 5.0 IP or more in 4 straight, and 7 of 8. He was 4-0 with a 1.93 ERA in his previous 4G/3GS. He had not allowed more than 4R in any start, until allowing 8R and 6R in his last two starts. McCall had tied a club record by winning 5 straight decisions, May 23-June 26... has also allowed 11HR in his last 33.2 IP, after giving up just 1HR in his first 38.1 IP of the season.
- **Start Me Up:** McCall's first 7 appearances of the season came in relief... In 11G as a starter, McCall is 4-2 with a 4.71 ERA (57.1 IP, 65H, 33R, 30ER, 22BB, 38K)... ERA as a starter was 2.96 until his last two starts.
- **McCall vs. Bears:** McCall has faced Newark three times, all in relief (2-0, 0.00, 6.1 IP, 1H, 0R, 0BB, 5K)... retired first 9-in-a-row and 10 of 11 in a 3.1-inning performance, earning the win on May 7 in Newark... also earned the win on June 26 in Newark, entering in the 4th inning with two men on base and allowing neither to score.
- **2010:** Retired 26 of 28 his last 3G in relief, including 9, 8, and 7 consecutively; only an infield hit, broken-bat hit, and error had led to baserunners... Final 8.2 innings in relief were scoreless... Made first 7 appearances of season in relief... Fired 6.0 shutout innings May 23 at BRG, the day after Bob Zimmermann worked 6.0 scoreless... worked 7.0 IP and retired 14 of 15 at one point, giving up only 3R, June 3 vs. SOM... allowed just 1HR in first 38.1 IP this season, until giving up 3HR in a matter of two innings, June 9 vs. BRG... fired 6.0 shutout innings and allowed only three hits (two bloop hits), while walking just one, June 14 at CAM... earned the win in Revs' record-setting 20-2 victory at Lancaster on June 19... earned two wins in three days (starting and then relieving), June 24-26; included rubber-game win in crucial series vs. Somerset.
- **Previous Career:** Has pitched as a starter and reliever throughout his 10-year pro career (61-55, 4.21 ERA)... began career in Oakland organization as a 10th-round draft pick... has spent all or parts of the last 3 years in Marlins system between High-A and Double-A... pitched in Northern League late last season, going 6-0 with 2.54 ERA in 8GS for Gary... was called up to AAA multiple times with Oakland, but never made an appearance.

#31 Ryan Basner - RHP Signed May 18... did not allow a run or walk in first 5.0 IP... Went 1.0 IP or less in each of first 18G... had 1.65 ERA through first 18G... Worked 4 straight perfect innings, June 4-11... retired 28 of 33 BF over 10G, June 4-24 (allowed 1R on 2H over 9.2 IP)... went 3-2 with 6SV and 2.88 ERA for SOM last season... former 7th round pick of ATL; spent entire previous career with ATL, including parts of 4 seasons at AAA.

#23 Jim Heuser - LHP Last 5G: 4.1 IP, 0R, 1H, 1BB, 2K... Acquired from LAN in trade for Adam Witter, June 11... went 1-0 with a 3.71 ERA in 21G with Lancaster... Had solid 6G stretch, June 18-27: 3.2 IP, 1H, 0R, 1BB, 5K... pitched in 6 of 7 days, June 23-29... struck out two LHH on 6 pitches, June 24 vs. SOM.

#31 John Muller - RHP Acquired from LAN with Adam Witter in trade for Salomon Manriquez on May 26... First 5G with York: 4SV, 6.0 IP, 2H, 0R, lowered ERA to 1.09... went 1-1 with a 1.45 ERA in 15G/1GS for LAN; held opponents to .164 average... earned SV in Revs' 200th win in his first appearance, May 28 vs. his former team... pitched in both games of June 20 DH in Lancaster, and earned SV in opener, striking out both he faced... ERA was at 1.76 through June 20... walked only 3 in first 12.0 IP with York... 5SV in June set a club record for that month... converted each of first 7 SV opportunities; 7SV is a Revs' First Half record (previous: Nick McCurdy-6 in 2008).

#28 Celson Polanco - RHP Signed/activated July 8... owns career 3.57 ERA... spent last two seasons in Blue Jays organization, reaching Double-A last year... posted 2.17 ERA for Dunedin in 2008... originally signed with Astros in 2002... has made 37 career starts (last in 2007 before York debut).

#34 Jason Richardson - RHP Allowed no runs in 8.0 IP spanning 6G, May 29-June 11... allowed 1H in 8.2 IP spanning 7G, May 29-June 15... walked none and struck out 10 over the course of 7G (7.1 IP), May 21-June 6... Began season on 8.2-inning scoreless streak; first 6 outings were scoreless... Made three appearances with York during the season's final week last year... spent previous two years in SOM bullpen (2007-08); went 9-2 with a 3.69 ERA for Patriots' championship team in 2008... reached AAA with BOS in 2006, and also has time in MIN/ATL systems.

#17 Matt Riley - LHP In relief: 31.0 IP, 18ER, 28H, 22BB, 39K (31G) = 5.23 ERA... Last 4G: 3.2 IP, 8H, 9ER, 7BB, 4K (1-0 record)... Allowed just 1ER in first 13.1 IP of relief... ERA out of the 'pen was at 2.25 through first 23G, 2.96 through first 27G (July 9)... Walked only 3 while striking out 17 in his first 13G in relief... Entered in a bases-loaded, no-out jam and allowed no runs, May 18 vs. LI.

#20 R.J. Rodriguez - RHP Retired 19-in-a-row, June 16-24... 17 of 21 outings have been scoreless... Has allowed just 2R on 3H in 13.1 IP last 12G (6BB, 18K); allowed no runs and no hits in first 8.0 IP on that stretch, and 3 of those walks came in last outing (one intentional)... Did not allow run in 8.1 IP over 7G, May 29-June 10 (beginning with second appearance)... Signed May 24... led Carolina League with 27 SV last year for Lynchburg... in 4 pro seasons, is 17-11 with a 3.78 ERA and 72SV... spent first 3 years in SD system, before pitching in PIT system last season.

#16 Sean Stidfole - RHP Team record 18.1-inning scoreless streak, May 19-June 22; also went team-record 17-straight appearances without allowing a run... Last 27G: 27.2 IP, 20H, 2R, 5BB, 17K (5BB, 22K last 29G)... Earned SV in 3 straight appearances, May 30-June 18; 5SV is career-high... Struck out side for first SV, completing sweep May 30 vs. LAN... Joined team in spring training after being released late by Toronto, despite 3-1, 3.70 ERA at AAA Las Vegas last year, and 3.27 ERA at AAA Syracuse the year before... is 18-13 for career with 3.68 ERA in 5 pro seasons, all with TOR.

#10 Eroid Andrus - OF

Yesterday: 2-5, 2B, RBI, 2R, BB

Series: 2-9, 2B, RBI, 2R

Streak: 1 (2-5)

- Started at all 3 OF positions in his first 4 games... Signed June 11... hit .368 over 8-game hitting streak, beginning with second game played... HR in back-to-back games, June 18-19 at LAN... 19-game errorless streak, June 13-July 1... hit .354 on 12-game hitting streak, June 25-July 9.
- Is the older brother of Texas Rangers SS Elvis Andrus... has played in the NYY, MIN, and TB organizations, reaching Double-A Montgomery with the Rays in 2007 and 2008... is a career .270 hitter in 9 pro seasons... hit .302 with 9HR, 48RBI, and 15SB in 90G with Florence in the Frontier League last season, his first foray into independent baseball... was one of the top hitters in the Venezuelan Winter League this year.

#9 Ian Bladergroen - 1B

Yesterday: 1-4, 2B, RBI, R, HBP

Series: 1-7, 2B, RBI, R

Streak: 1 (1-4)

- Selected to 2nd career All-Star Game (also 2004); became second player in Revs history to take part in HR Derby (Nate Espy '07)... 12HR was Revs' most ever in First Half; 44RBI was 2 shy of Tom Collaro's club record... Hit .565 with 4 HR and 11 RBI on 5-game streak, June 24-28 (9 RBI in final 3G of that stretch)... HR in back-to-back games, June 25-26 at NWK, and crushed two more HR, each giving the Revs the lead, two nights later vs. LI (4HR in 4G)... Had Revs' only hit 6/10 vs. BRG... Tied game with HR in 8th and won it with walk-off HR in 13th, June 3 vs. SOM: went 5-for-7 with then-club-record 12TB, 3rd career multi-HR game (second in two years), first career 5-hit game, first walk-off HR, 4th walk-off HR in Revs history, first by someone who had already gone deep in that game, 3rd extra-inning HR (latest inning)... Hit .344 on 7-game hitting streak, May 28-June 3... Went 31 games without committing an error, April 25-June 1... Became 5th in Revs history to collect two sac flies in one game, May 12 at LI... Homered 3x in 4G, April 30-May 4... Revs record 8HR and 26 RBI in June; tied June record with 38 hits.
- Returns to the ALPB after playing in the Mariners farm system last year... was signed by Seattle after playing for the Road Warriors in 2007 and Lancaster in 2008... was leading the league with 26RBI through 26 games with the Barnstormers in 2008 before breaking his hand on a HBP... had hit 7HR as a visiting player at Sovereign Bank Stadium... was the Mets' #4 prospect, and the NL's #8 hitting prospect after batting .342 with Capital City in 2004... was traded to Boston for Doug Mientkiewicz, becoming the Red Sox' top first base prospect.

#19 Ramon Castro - INF

- Has 42 RBI last 48G... Thursday was first multi RBI game since June 19 (GS); now has 6RBI last 3G.
- Blasted grand slam in Revs' 14-13 comeback win, July 15 at LI... Selected to second AL All-Star Game (also 2008, ASG MVP)... 44 First Half RBI was 2 shy of Tom Collaro's team record... Started every game batting 3rd until July 2, the night after the Revs clinched... 9-game hitting streak (.389), June 11-19... Had "GW RBI" on 1st inning groundout in Revs' 20-2 win at LAN, June 19... Tied game with two-out RBI single in 9th, one pitch before Herrera's walk-off HR, 6/8 vs. BRG... 15-game hitting streak, May 21-June 5 (hit .390, was league's longest to that point of season / T-5th longest in Revs history)... reached base in each of first 30G he'd played (longest on-base streak in league to that point of season, #3 longest in Revs history)... tied Jason Aspito's club record with an RBI in 9 straight games, May 23-June 1 (16RBI total, the most prolific RBI stretch in club history)... Homered twice, June 1 at SOM, two years to the day after Aspito homered twice at home vs. the Patriots; became first Rev to go deep twice in a road game at SOM... Set a club record for RBI in May with 23... First Revs HR bounced off top of Arch Nemesis and over, providing the eventual winning RBI against his former team (NWK), May 15... Became the first Revs hitter ever to record three doubles in one game, May 11 at Long Island... Reached base in 10 of first 17 plate appearances (.588 OBP)... Activated May 6; reached base four times (single, 3 walks) in his debut that night vs. Somerset
- Is a career .348 hitter in the Atlantic League, batting .343 for Newark in 2007 (#3 in AL), and .352 (#2) with 23 homeruns in 2008... also led the league with a .448 OBP for the champion Bears in 2007... played in 9 MLB games with Oakland in 2004, and spent last year in the SF Giants system at Connecticut (AA), after returning to NWK for three games early in the season.

#41 Sandy DeLeon - C
