

# YORK Revolution Game Notes

**YORK REVOLUTION (49-38, 9-8) vs. Camden Riversharks (46-42, 7-11)**

**Game #88 - Tuesday, July 27, 2010, 7:00 p.m.**

**Sovereign Bank Stadium - York, PA**

**RHP Corey Thurman (7-6, 4.52) vs. LHP Josh Brey (4-7, 6.97)**

**RevITUP!** The First Half champion Revolution continue their homestand (4-0) tonight with game two of four against the Sharks. The homestand was to be a season-long 8-gamer, but is now a rain-shortened 7-gamer. The Revs took the first 3 vs. LAN, earning a rain-shortened sweep, their second at home this season vs. the Barnstormers, and second sweep of Lancaster in franchise history. It was also the Revs' second sweep overall this season. The Revs are within half a game of Lancaster for first place for the second straight game, the closest they've been so far in the second half. They are over .500 for the first time in the second half, and are within one of matching their highwater mark overall for the season (12 games over .500, last on June 28, at 38-26. Tonight is the 494th game in Revolution history.

**Case of the Runs:** The Revs have scored 10+ runs in 6 of the last 13 games. York leads the league in runs scored with 498 (5.6 per game). The Revs also have double-digit hits in 8 of the last 9 games, with the only exception being a 9-hit game on Saturday. The Revs had also scored the game's first run in 6 consecutive games until last night.

**Back in Gear:** The Revs have won 5 consecutive games for the first time since winning a club record 8-in-a-row, August 8-15, 2008. The Revs are also 8-3 in their last 11 games, after going 3-9 in their previous 12 games. The Revs snapped a 5-series winless streak by taking 2 of 3 at Somerset earlier in the week, and have now won back-to-back series.

**Taking it to the Bank:** The Revs have begun the current homestand 4-0, marking the fifth time in club history they've started a homestand 4-0. It's the first time they've done it since winning the opening 4 games of the second half last season against Bridgeport at home. The Revs are now 25-20 at home overall for the year, 19-10 since May 20. The Revs are 132-113 all-time at Sovereign Bank Stadium.

**At the Gate:** The Revs are averaging 5,674 fans over their last 7 home games (39,719 total). This past weekend's combined total of 15,488 is the most for a 3-game series this season, and came within roughly 300 fans of the all-time record for a three-game series. The Revs have now had a total of 966,088 fans come through the gates in four years. The countdown to the 1,000,000th fan is currently at 33,912.

**For Starters:** Revs starting pitchers over the last 7G: 5-1, 3.78 ERA (33.1 IP, 35H, 16R, 14ER, 12BB, 25K, 3HR). Three starters (Sanchez-last Monday, Thurman-last Wednesday, McCall-Friday) earned their first wins since June 20, 22, and 24 respectively, snapping 3, 3, and 2-game losing streaks. Those three are tied for the team lead with 7 wins; Thurman goes for his 8th tonight. It's a major improvement over the previous 7G: 1-4, 11.83 ERA (29.2 IP, 55H, 42R, 39ER, 17BB, 20K, 11HR), and the previous 11G: 2-7, 10.54 ERA (48.2 IP, 81H, 60R, 57ER, 25BB, 32K, 16HR).

**Refill on Ink:** The Revs' pen over the last 7G: 28.2 IP, 16H, 6R, 6ER, 11BB, 22K (1.88 ERA).

**First Half Champs:** The Revs finished the First Half with a record of 40-30, just one win shy of matching their best half ever. It was by far their best First Half ever; in fact, it was their first winning record in a first half (had finished 11, 10, and 18 games under .500 the first three years). The Revs finished with a 4.0-game lead over Somerset, and spent 39 games in First Place, including each of the final 21. Since May 22 (13-15), the Revs finished 27-15, winning 9 of their final 13 series (9 of 11 at one point).

**Worst to First!** The Revs are just the 3rd team in league history to go from dead last overall, to first half champs the following year (Nashua 1999-2000, Newark 2006-07). Both of those clubs won the league championship; the Bears' 2007 team was led by current Revs Herrera, Castro, Pachot, and V.Rodriguez. Prior to the Revolution, York's last pro baseball team, the 1969 York Pirates, won the Eastern League pennant with an 89-50 record (.640) after going 58-82 the year before (.414, 5th place, 26.5 GB).

**History Lesson:** The Revs have sewn up their second playoff berth in club history, and the 13th playoff berth for any pro team from York. This September, they'll try to become the 5th team in York pro baseball history to go all the way to a league title, and first since the York Pirates were declared 1969 Eastern League co-champions with Pittsfield in their final year, despite trailing the series 1-0 before several rain postponements. York teams also won championships in 1904, 1906, and 1925.

**Suring it Up:** The Revs have committed just 43 errors in the last 73 games. Over the last 9 games, they've committed just 2E, while opponents have made 12E.. The Revs had a club record 8-game errorless streak, June 9-16 (went a record 76 consecutive innings without a miscue), and have had 43 games this season where they've not committed an error (opponents have had just 33 such games); they're already approaching the club record of 46 errorless games in 2007. The record for a 140-game season is only 43 games (2008), which they've already matched.

**Slamming the Door:** The Revs' pitching staff has finished leads after at least the 6th in 37 of their last 40 tries (25-in-a-row to begin that streak). The 'pen has recorded SVs in 19 of the last 28 wins (Muller-7, Stidfole-7, Rodriguez-4, Hampson-1).

**Revs vs. Sharks:** This is the first series between the two clubs in the season's second half; they last met June 14-17, when the Revs took 3 of 4 in South Jersey. York is 7-4 vs. Camden this season (5-2 in Camden, 2-2 at home), and the Revs are 6-2 vs. the Sharks over the last 8 meetings. It's Camden's first visit to SBS since opening week. The Revs' success in Camden during the First Half was unprecedented: of Camden's first 10 losses at home, 5 came against the Revs, who already tied the most wins they've ever had in one season at Campbell's Field (5-5 last year). The Revs are 35-34 all-time vs. the Sharks (18-15 home, 17-19 road). The two clubs went 10-10 against each other in each of the last two seasons.

**This Date in York Baseball History:** July 27, 2007 - OF Peter Bergeron is signed by the Pirates, and assigned to Altoona (AA).

## Today's Starter: RHP Corey Thurman

**Last Start:** Combined on a 3-hit shutout, winning 7-0 at Somerset on Wednesday, to earn his team high-tying 7th win... line = 5.1 IP, 3H, 0R, 2BB, 5K... retired 10-in-a-row to start the game... threw 4 pitches in the first inning, all for strikes - inning included a 22-minute delay for a power malfunction... struck out the side in the second... carried a no-hitter through 4.1 innings, and took a 1-hitter into the 6th... was coming off his roughest start of the year, losing 7-3 vs. Newark the week before (his last home start)... snapped a three-game losing streak... was his first win since June 22 vs. Somerset... tonight is looking to earn his first win vs. a team other than Somerset, since winning 15-1 at Camden on June 16.

**All-Time Leader:** Thurman is the Revs' all-time wins leader, a distinction that he notched on June 22 vs. Somerset, moving past Wayne Franklin (2007-2009). He is 22-18 for his Revs career; Franklin was 20-8.

**Streaks:** Thurman began the season 4-0 for the first time in his pro career, and became the first pitcher in Revs history to open a season 4-0 over a single stint (Wayne Franklin did it over two stints with the club in 2007, and Bob Zimmermann later joined Thurman at 4-0 this season)... at that point had matched his longest career winning streak by winning 6-in-a-row dating back to last season (longest career streak with York)... 4 straight wins matched his longest single-season winning streak with York for the third time (twice in 2008)... then went on a 3-game losing streak, his longest skid since beginning the 2008 season 0-5... went on to win back-to-back starts, before losing 3 straight again, a streak that he snapped with a win in his last start... is just 3-6 over last 9 decisions after 4-0 start... Revs have lost 7 of his last 10 starts after winning 6 of first 7, and each of first 5.

**That Close:** Thurman came within a whisker of masterpieces in back-to-back starts, June 27 at Newark and July 2 vs. Bridgeport. In Newark, he was one out away from allowing just 1R through 7.0 IP, but allowed a bases-clearing triple to Kennard Jones after hitting the #9 batter with an 0-2 pitch... he ended up with a ND, charged with 4R in 6.2 IP, after retiring 11 of previous 12 hitters entering the 7th. Against Bridgeport, he allowed just 3H (two infield hits and a bloop) through 5.0 scoreless, and was one out away from allowing just 1ER through 7.0 IP, but gave up a three-run HR to Danny Putnam (finished 7.0 IP, 6R, 4ER).

**In the Park:** Thurman has allowed just 3HR in his last 7GS, after allowing 10HR in first 10GS, including 3 (back-to-back-to-back) on June 5 at SMD.

**Thurm vs. Sharks in 2010:** 3GS, 2-0, 2.87 ERA (ND 4/27 in York: 4.2 IP, 2R... W 8-2 5/24 in CAM: 5.0 IP, 2R, 0K... W 15-1 6/16 in CAM: 6.0 IP, 1R)

**Thurman vs. Sharks in 2009:** 1-0, 3.27 ERA, 2GS (both at home)

**Thurman vs. Sharks in 2008:** 3-1, 1.06, 5GS, (34 IP, 4ER, 23H)... allowed just 2ER in final 29.0 IP against Camden, and combined on a shutout in back-to-back starts at Camden (June 6 and July 8, 2008)

**Career vs. Sharks:** 6-1, 1.93 ERA (60.2 IP, 13ER)... currently owns a 6-game winning streak against the Riversharks... has not lost to them since April 26, 2008 at Campbell's Field, his first start in a Revolution uniform

**Career at Campbell's Field:** 5GS, 4-1, 1.45 ERA (31.0 IP, 5ER)... combined on shutouts twice at Campbell's Field in 2008.

**2010:** Was the Revs' Opening Night starter, marking the second straight year that he started the Home Opener... came within one out of a win, allowing just two runs in 4.2 IP vs. Camden on April 27... allowed just two hits in 5.0 innings, earning his first win, May 2 at Lancaster... struck out Scott Spiezio looking for his 200th strikeout with the Revs, May 14 vs. Newark, coming in his record 50th start with the Revs... allowed 4SB in one inning (3 by Lydon, including double steal of home), Memorial Day at SOM... established a Revs record for wins in May with 4... allowed exactly 2R in 6 consecutive starts, April 27-May 24... did not allow more than 2R in any start until his 8th start (May 31 at SOM, 4R)... allowed back-to-back-to-back HR leading off the 6th on just 4 pitches, 6/5 at SMD; occurred after giving up just 1R in first 5.0 IP... earned record-tying 20th win in Revolution uniform on June 16 in Camden (6.0 IP, 3H, 1R, 1BB, 7K)... earned his record 21st win in a York uniform, beating Somerset to begin the crucial head-to-head series, June 22 in York... was one out away from allowing just 1R through 7.0 IP, but allowed a bases-loaded triple to Kennard Jones, June 27 at NWK; Revs eventually squandered five-run lead and lost... was working on a masterpiece the night after the Revs clinched (July 2 vs. BRG), with just three hits (two infield knocks and a bloop) through first 5.0 shutout innings, until being charged with 4ER in 7.0 IP after a series of close pitches that were called balls, leading to Etchebarren's ejection; worked 7.0 IP for the first time since nearly a year before (7/3/09 at LAN); 8K was his most since 8/18/08 at SMD, and the most by a Revs pitcher this season.

**2009:** Became the first pitcher in Revs history to start in the Atlantic League All-Star Game; fired two scoreless innings for the Freedom Division... his 3.28 ERA would have finished T-2nd in the league given enough innings to qualify and would have set a Revs record for a single season, but was forced to miss nearly two months with small blood clots in his pitching hand... was scratched from his first scheduled start of the second half on July 13 with numbness in his hand (Revs were in midst of 4-0 start); was scheduled to face SMD, but Revs went on to lose 5 straight from that point, falling out of contention for the remainder of the year... placed on DL on July 18... returned to the mound on September 12 at home against Lancaster, and made two starts in September, allowing just 1ER in 9.0 IP... won 4 of his final 5 decisions... went 2-3 with a 5.14 ERA at home (opp .319), but was 2-0 with a 0.75 ERA on the road (opp .183)... allowed only 4HR all year (went 8 starts without allowing one at one point), after serving up 29HR in 2008... struck out the first four he faced to begin the season, and allowed just one bloop hit in 5.0 near-perfect innings in his first start, April 26, 2009 at BRG.

**2008:** Went 11-9 with a 5.39 ERA for the Revs, making a team-record and career-high 29 starts (tied for league lead)... became Revs' first 10-game winner when he defeated Long Island on September 4, 2008... his 165.1 IP ranked #4 in AL, came within two outs of matching his career-high, and is a Revs' single-season record... T-4th in league with 129K... Revs won 16 of his final 22 starts (11-3, 4.05) after losing his first six (0-5, 9.49); twice won 4 straight (won 8 of 9, 11 of 13 after opening season with career-worst 5-game losing streak)... combined on 4 of team's 8 shutouts, including in back-to-back starts, June 6-12, 2008, part of team-record 24-inning scoreless streak... named Atlantic League's Pitcher of the Month in June (4-0, 1.64) winning the Revs' first-ever monthly award.

**In the Revs' record book:** All-time franchise leader in career wins (22), starts (62), strikeouts (252), innings (340.0), quality starts (18), pickoffs (8)... entering his 3rd season with York, joining only Jason Aspito, Keoni DeRenne, Luis Taveras, Wayne Franklin, and Jason Olson as the 6 players / 3 pitchers to have suited up with the Revs for parts of 3 seasons.

### **Previous Career:**

- 13th pro season... Spent all of 2002 and part of 2003 in the majors with Toronto (3-4, 4.75, 49G, 4GS)... debuted at age 23... fired 1.2 scoreless innings in his major league debut, April 5 vs. Minnesota; struck out Doug Mientkiewicz, the first batter he faced... fired 6.0 scoreless innings in his first major league start, August 2, 2003 at Anaheim
- Came up with the Royals organization after being drafted in the fourth round of the 1996 draft... led the Carolina League with a 2.26 ERA in 2000... was a Texas League All-Star with Wichita in 2001
- Underwent rotator cuff surgery in 2004, performed by Dr. James Andrews in Birmingham... Returned to affiliated ball with the Brewers' Double-A affiliate in Huntsville in 2006 and was among league leaders with a 2.96 ERA... was one of the Southern League's best relievers with Huntsville in 2007.

### **Personal:**

- Graduate of Texas High School in Texarkana, TX where he was a teammate of major league outfielder Craig Monroe... Lives in York year-round, giving private lessons at Sovereign Bank Stadium during the off-season... is the son of a retired Army captain, and was born at Fort Gordon (GA); moved to Germany and Korea with the family, and eventually back to the U.S. at Fort Belvoir (VA) by age three... was recruited out of high school to play college football.

**#31 Ryan Basner - RHP** Signed May 18... did not allow a run or walk in first 5.0 IP... Went 1.0 IP or less in each of first 18G... had 1.65 ERA through first 18G... Worked 4 straight perfect innings, June 4-11... retired 28 of 33 BF over 10G, June 4-24 (allowed 1R on 2H over 9.2 IP)... went 3-2 with 6SV and 2.88 ERA for SOM last season... former 7th round pick of ATL; spent entire previous career with ATL, including parts of 4 seasons at AAA.

**#23 Jim Heuser - LHP** Last 9G: 7.0 IP, 0R, 6H, 1BB, 4K... threw 14 P, 13 strikes in his appearance on Saturday (1.0 IP, 1H, 0R, 0BB, 2K)... Acquired from LAN in trade for Adam Witter, June 11... went 1-0 with a 3.71 ERA in 21G with Lancaster... Had solid 6G stretch, June 18-27: 3.2 IP, 1H, 0R, 1BB, 5K... pitched in 6 of 7 days, June 23-29... struck out two LHH on 6 pitches, June 24 vs. SOM.

**#30 A.J. Murray - LHP** Retired all 6BF on 6 groundouts in first 2G with Revs... Signed July 18... began season at AAA Nashville (MIL), posting 4.44 ERA in 23G... went combined 4-2 with 2.86 ERA last season, spent mostly at AAA Oklahoma City (TEX)... spent previous 7 years in Rangers system, reaching MLB in 2007 and 2008 (2-2, 4.29, 14G, 4GS)... owns 3.40 career minor league ERA.

**#33 Vince Perkins - RHP** Obtained along with future considerations from NWK, in trade for Bob Zimmermann and Shane Youman on July 18... owned a 4.93 ERA with Newark; allowed 0ER in final 5G/7.0 IP with Bears... pitched with Camden in 2008, earning contract with Cubs... went 7-2 with 3.02 ERA in Chicago system last season, mostly at AAA Iowa... originally drafted by Toronto, and was one of the Blue Jays' top prospects as a starter... has pitched for Team Canada in WBC in 2006 and 2009... was a teammate of Corey Thurman with Huntsville (AA) in 2007.

**#28 Celson Polanco - RHP** Signed/activated July 8... owns career 3.57 ERA... spent last two seasons in Blue Jays organization, reaching Double-A last year... posted 2.17 ERA for Dunedin in 2008... originally signed with Astros in 2002... has made 37 career starts (last in 2007 before York debut) ... in relief (3G): 6.2 IP, 0R, 3H, 0BB, 9K... tied Revs' season relief highs in IP and K in last outing, and broke relief record for consecutive hitters retired with 11, including an error that would have been an out (previous record: 10-Byron Batson, 6/22/07 vs. Somerset).

**#34 Jason Richardson - RHP** 6-game scoreless streak (5.2 IP, 3H) snapped in last appearance... Allowed no runs in 8.0 IP spanning 6G, May 29-June 11... allowed 1H in 8.2 IP spanning 7G, May 29-June 15... walked none and struck out 10 over the course of 7G (7.1 IP), May 21-June 6... Began season on 8.2-inning scoreless streak; first 6 outings were scoreless... Made three appearances with York during the season's final week last year... spent previous two years in SOM bullpen (2007-08); went 9-2 with a 3.69 ERA for Patriots' championship team in 2008... reached AAA with BOS in 2006, and also has time in MIN/ATL systems.

**#17 Matt Riley - LHP** Has allowed just 2R on 3H in 5.0 IP last 3G (allowed 9ER on 8H and 7BB in 3.2 IP previous 4G)... Total in relief: 36.0 IP, 20ER, 31H, 25BB, 42K (34G) = 5.00 ERA... Allowed just 1ER in first 13.1 IP of relief... ERA out of the 'pen was 2.25 through first 23G, 2.96 through first 27G (July 9)... Walked only 3 while striking out 17 in first 13G in relief... Entered bases-loaded no-out jam and allowed no runs 5/18 vs. LI.

**#16 Sean Stidfole - RHP** Team record 18.1-inning scoreless streak, May 19-June 22; also went team-record 17-straight appearances without allowing a run... Had another 8-game, 8.2-inning scoreless streak snapped last Sunday; has come back with two scoreless 9th innings since... Last 32G: 32.1 IP, 24H, 3R, 6BB, 22K (6BB, 27K last 34G)... 7SV is career-high... Earned SV in 3 straight appearances, June 13-18... Struck out side for first SV, completing sweep May 30 vs. LAN... Joined team in spring training after being released late by Toronto, despite 3-1, 3.70 ERA at AAA Las Vegas last year, and 3.27 ERA at AAA Syracuse the year before... is 18-13 for career with 3.68 ERA in 5 pro seasons, all with TOR.
